AR-5 <u>Provost's Report</u>

Mr. Mandel provided a summary of recent events on campus celebrating faculty, including at the University Faculty Awards, visits from Nobel laureates, and a conference on artificial intelligence.

Mr. Mandel then summarized the university's efforts in interdisciplinary collaboration for research, practice and creative endeavors. He presented a video regarding the creation of a Health and Wellness Center on Lehigh that brought together faculty, students and staff from CPH and Pharmacy. He further noted the recommendations of the Interdisciplinary Collaboration Committee and which of those are top priorities in the near term.

Finally, Mr. Mandel provided updates on new leadership in student affairs and the School of Pharmacy, as well as the search for the next leader of the Graduate School.
