## **Scope of Policy**

The Temple University Presidential Advisory Committee on Intercollegiate Athletics (hereafter PACIA) is hereby established. This Committee replaces both the Temple University Advisory Committee in Intercollegiate Athletics, established in 1993, and the Athletics Advisory Board, established in 2002.

## **Responsibility**:

The Temple University Presidential Advisory Committee on Intercollegiate Athletics is an advisory committee to the President to make recommendations on issues such as: enhancing student athlete wellbeing, gender equity in athletic opportunities, sportsmanship, academic integrity, non-discrimination and diversity, processes to assure NCAA rules compliance, and such other matters on which the President specifically requests advice. It will report regularly to the President and, as requested, to the Board of Trustees Committee on Academic Affairs, Student Services, and Diversity.

#### Membership:

- **5** Faculty Representatives, appointed by the President or their designee for three-year terms, in consultation with the Faculty Senate
- 4 Administration Representatives, appointed by the President or their designee for three-year terms, of whom at least two shall either: (1) hold an academic appointment, (2) be directly responsible to the President, or (3) serve as a chief administrative official (e.g., admissions director, finance officer, department head, or athletics department head)
- 1 NCAA Faculty Athletics Representative, Chair of the Committee
- 1 Athletics Coach, nominated by the Director of Athletics and appointed by the President for a two-year term

- 2 Student-athletes, nominated by the Director of Athletes and appointed by the President for one-year terms from the membership of the Student Athletics Advisory Committee (one man, one woman)
- 1 student, who is not a student-athlete, nominated by Temple Student Government and appointed by the President for a one-year term
- 1 Alumni/ae representative, nominated by the Temple University Alumni Association and appointed by the President, for a two-year term

### One-time appointments for staggered terms in 2007:

Faculty and Administration Representatives appointed in 2007 shall have staggered terms as follows:

- 1 Faculty Representative shall be appointed for a one-year term
- 1 Faculty Representative and 1 Administration Representative shall be appointed for twoyear terms
- 1 Faculty Representative and 1 Administration Representative shall be appointed for oneyear terms
- 3 faculty members and 2 administrative representatives shall be appointed for three-year terms

## Ex officio (nonvoting):

Provost, Executive Vice President, University Counsel, Vice President for Student Affairs, Director of Athletics, Associate Directors of Athletics, Assistant Athletic Director for Compliance, Director of Academic Support, Athletic Certifying Officer, and Director of Academic Advising Center. Ex officio members may be represented by appropriate designees.

#### Chair:

The Faculty Athletics Representative

#### **Meetings**:

The PACIA may set its own meeting schedule, but there shall be at least three meetings annually.

### Representation on the Board of Trustees Committee on Athletics:

Each year, two faculty representatives shall be designated by the Faculty Senate from the faculty representatives on the PACIA, to serve as non-voting representatives to the Board of Trustees Committee on Athletics.
